



Our core mission remains the same: we facilitate relationships, dialogue, and learning between social change agents around the world. But as we grow and expand, we continue to find new ways to enact this mission. What remains consistent – if anything – is a posture of openness and curiosity, a commitment to working in partnership, to learning and unlearning, to not-turning-away. This is what we find in the empty bowl of Omprakash, and it is at the root of what we hope to offer.

In the pages that follow, we invite you to explore what blossoms from these roots. Indeed, by some measures, the empty bowl is overflowing: in 2024, Omprakash Partners set an all-time fundraising record; we offered Partner Development Grants to 32 organizations; we educated a record number of EdGE students, and we funded all of our core operational costs with earned revenue – thus enabling us to channel all donations towards grants and scholarships that directly benefit our Partners and our students. Yet there is no finish line to cross, and no mountaintop to seek. There is only this blossoming, and the ways we nurture it.

As we reflect on our past two decades, we give thanks for this abundance, and for all who have made it possible. We look forward to what comes next.



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
# 20 Years of Omprakash, in 5 Charts

## **Omprakash Revenue, 2005-2024**



From 2005-2012, we relied entirely on donations and grants, but in the years since, we have successfully developed a sustainable stream of mission-aligned earned revenue via EdGE program fees and the modest 2% fee that we charge to Omprakash Partners who fundraise via our fiscal sponsorship. Meanwhile, we continue to minimize admin costs, and the majority of our expenditure goes towards payroll for our fully-remote global team. Whenever possible, we reinvest surplus revenue into our "Special Programs": grants, scholarships, and conferences that directly benefit our students and Partners around the world.


## **Omprakash Expenditure, 2005-2024**



## **Earned Revenue as % of Core Expenditure**




## **Omprakash Partner Fundraising**



The first chart on this page illustrates our transition towards financial sustainability over the past decade: as our earned revenue covers a greater and greater share of our core expenditure, we are able to reinvest donations, grants, and surplus revenue into the 'Special Programs' that directly benefit our Partners and students. The second chart shows the steady growth of fundraising by Omprakash Partners who utilize our fiscal sponsorship and our web platform to collect resources in support of their own social impact work around the world. The third chart shows the increasing number of students whom we impact via our diverse portfolio of EdGE programs.

Rather, it is to keep battling with these questions, keep questioning ourselves and our motives and our methods, and not get complacent in this type of work.
